Welcome to the month of November celebrating All Saints' Sunday, the day for pulling out the old family photograph albums and remembering our ancestors in Christian faith. During my ministry at our church, there have been precious people who joined Christian saints.

Among them is Pat Ekelund. What comes to your mind in thinking of Pat? I would say, "She was faithful to God, responsible, sweet, and generous." Although more than 3 years have passed, I still vision her sitting at the pew during the Sunday service. Although she was challenged physically, she was there to praise and worship God, which impressed me very much. We modern Christians try to find an excuse not to come to church on Sunday. Yet, she came to church with the portable oxygen tank. You and I should learn from her how to be faithful to God.

About four months before she passed away, I had an opportunity to converse with her. She told me how much God had blessed her through her life, and how thankful she was for her lovely family and friends. She also talked about our church history, and she did not forget to tell me that I was one of her favorite pastors. She liked me as a pastor, and I respected her who was active at our church. She is a real saint who loved God and our church.

Another person I want to comment on is Bill Suda, Jr. Whenever he came to the church, God's house, he looked like saying, "Today, I consider myself the happiest man in the world." Like all of us, he also had tough time in his life, but he had wisdom and faith to transform difficulty into hope, and sorrow into joy. Even when he was sick, he never gave up his faith.

Two days before Bill passed away, I stopped by his room at the hospital. As soon as he saw me at a distance, he gave me a lot of kisses. His kisses continued even after I sat down. I have never received that many kisses for 20 or 30 seconds. After we prayed the Lord's Prayer together, he tried to say something. Even if he was so weak that he could not express himself clearly, I knew what he wanted to say. He was ready to go to heaven. He loved me, and I loved him in Jesus Christ. He was like a member of my fan club, and he was my hero who taught me how to express my gratitude to God.

As we celebrate All Saints' Sunday, we make the very bold claim that all of our church ancestors are our relatives. Whenever we celebrate baptism, we want the newly baptized to meet our ancestors in Christian faith. We want our children and all those who are new to our church to know who their ancestors are, and to understand that being a saint means first and foremost belonging to God. Once you are baptized, you belong to God, and all that remains to be seen is what you will do about it.

Let us remember that we do not have to be famous or perfect to be Christian saints. We just have to be us by loving as we are loved by God, throwing our arms around the world, and shining like the sun. What is better, we do not have to do those things by ourselves. We have all this company, all these saints sitting around us, whom we can see for ourselves plus those we cannot, all of them calling our names and encouraging us.

Because we are part of them and they are part of us, all of us are knit together in the communion of saints. Let us come to the worship service on Sunday, November  $6^{th}$ , and commune with our all saints. Amen.
