April 2012

April begins with Holy Week that includes Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. About two thousand years ago, on the first Palm Sunday, there was a wonderful parade. When Jesus came to Jerusalem, a large crowd was following and shouting "Hosanna to the Son of David!"

They were very excited, but Jesus did not seem excited at all. Maybe, there was different expectation between the crowd and Jesus. The Jews expected and hoped for a new king, a warrior who would release them from Rome. However, Jesus came to Jerusalem to be killed by Romans on a cross. The crowd and Jesus had totally different expectations.

We also experience different expectation between God and us. Modern Christians are worried about our situation: Many Christian churches have struggled, and as a result, they have closed their church doors. Here are some questions based on human expectation. If God is almighty, why does God let Christian churches struggle continuously? If God blesses those who come to church with wealth and health, then much more people would attend Sunday worship and their churches would thrive.

In fact, some preachers have tried this kind of sermons. They preach: The more offering you give, the richer you will be. God will pay you back as much as you dedicate yourself to the church. If you do not come to church on Sunday, bad things will happen to you. If you do not treat your pastor well, God will be angry with you. How about that?

Interestingly, this kind of sermons has worked for some Christians, and their churches have become bigger and bigger. How is it possible? Like the crowd on Palm Sunday, we humans want dramatic and exiting stories. We humans tend to follow fantasia. Yet, reality is a totally different story. We Christians suffer from illness, death of loved ones, poverty, natural disasters, broken relations, and depression. In other words, we have the same problems as non-Christians experience.

Then, why do we worship God in Christianity? The answer is that although God does not get rid of our suffering, God gives us strength and faith to overcome it. God does not put the bread on the table for us, but God gives us hope so that we may rejoice even in poverty. God does not let us win all the time, but God gives us instruction through our failure. If your expectation to God is still based on worldly things, you will be disappointed, because God's expectation to you is focused on spiritual matters.

As we begin Holy Week, let us remember that God's way is often different from our way. And let us listen to Jesus' voice and try to have the same concept of victory as Jesus has. Then, we will share the real joy with Jesus Christ, who came to Jerusalem to save all of us from sins by dying on the cross. As we believe this, we will also be resurrected with Jesus Christ. Happy Holy Week!
