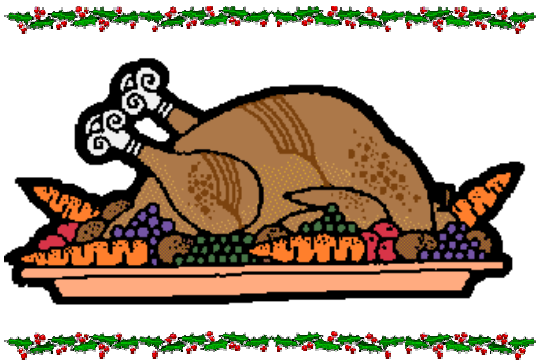
### CAROLING – SUNDAY DECEMBER 18<sup>th</sup>

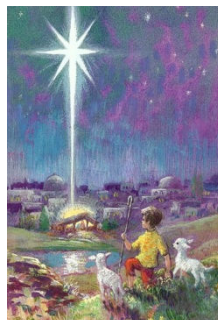
