THINK SMALL - THEN THINK BIG!

March 1st begins the season of Lent, a time of rebirth and new beginnings. At Bay Shore United Methodist Church, I want you to *think small*. That's right, think small.

Some of the most meaningful moments in the New Testament occurred when only a few people were present. Think about Jesus as a boy, sitting in the temple and teaching the rabbis. Elsewhere, we learn about Jesus visiting the home of Martha and Mary. Later, Jesus and a handful of others went to the tomb of Lazarus, where Jesus raised his beloved friend from the dead.

Small group gatherings allow us to connect with each other in ways that go far beyond casual friendship. Late last year we began a Women's Prayer Fellowship, a ministry that encourages both meaningful relationships with each other and a deeper faith in God. In the coming year, we will create opportunities for our youth to gather, to share, and to support one another as well. My dream is to see the men's fellowship reborn, too. Is God calling you to make these deeper connections? Is 2017 the year we commit ourselves and fully engage in the church and its ministry?

Now, I'd like you to think big. I'm asking each of you to pray that the church's finances will stabilize and grow in ways that allow us to draw up big plans for our future. The Church's childcare ministry is expanding significantly, and the Trustees are applying for grants that, with God's help, will enable us to undertake long-needed repairs and improvements. With additional resources, Bay Shore United Methodist can think big about our ministries and role in the community. Is God calling you to help shape our future? Is this the time we commit to improving our church and our community in amazing new ways?

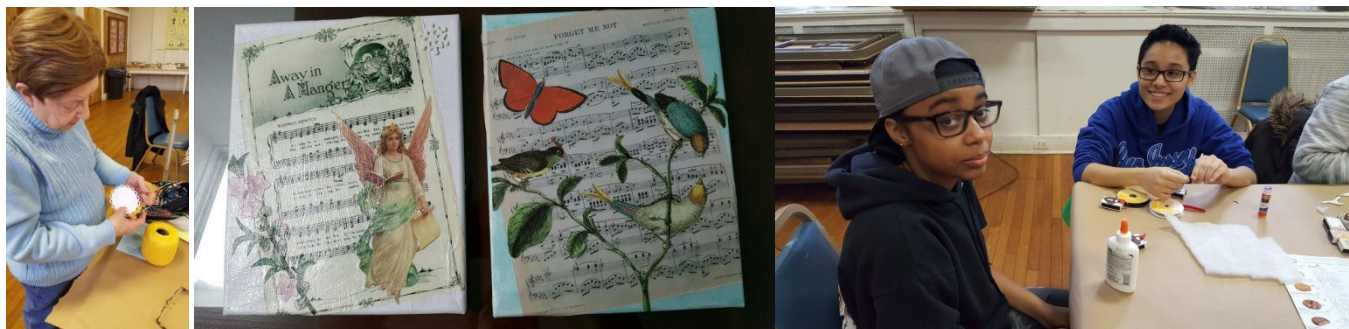
As you think about the coming year, I ask you to put Bay Shore United Methodist Church on your list of resolutions. How can we better ourselves and our church in ways that will impact future generations?

Please join us in traveling to different parts of God's Universal Church for rewarding fellowship and uplifting messages as we prepare for the resurrection of Christ.

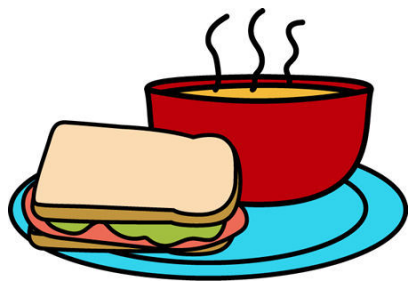

Read: John 4:1-26, the story of the woman at the well,

Reflect: The woman at the well had no name, and she was far from perfect. She was also doing her chores at noon – the hottest time of the day. And yet, after talking to Jesus, she went back to her village and told the people: “Come see a man who knew all about the things I did, who knows me inside and out. Do you think this could be the Messiah?” And they went out to see for themselves.

Act: How are you using your everyday encounters – sometimes with strangers – to show God’s love and share the Good News?

Pray: *O, Lord. Let me be a messenger for you, that I will be an example of faith and righteousness each and every day.*
