A CHANGE IN SEASONS BRINGS EXPECTATION

Also, autumn is a season of expectation for our ministry, to see the first phase of the restoration work come to completion.

Please see the Trustees report in this issue for an update on the restoration project. Thanks to you, our committed members and lovely neighbors in Bay Shore, Brightwaters, and beyond, from December 2017 through May 2018 we raised close to \$200,000 in capital campaign funds to restore the parsonage and church. Although the work has begun, we are still in need of another \$150,000 to reach our goal and complete the task.

We continue to trust in God: our hope, our confidence, our firm assurance, and our help in ages past. The Psalmist said "My soul, wait for thou only upon God; for my expectation is from [God]. (Psalm 62:5)

We look forward to the return of all the summer vacationers back to church on Rally Sunday, September 9 at 10 a.m.

RESTORATION UPDATE

The work on the parsonage is nearing the end, and the results so far have been terrific. Damage to the garage has been fully repaired, and the whole house now has a new roof, siding and windows. New outdoor lighting make coming and going easier and safer. Extensive interior repairs were also made to address urgent water and electrical issues. Finally, repairs to front walkway and stoop are in the works.

Work has begun on the church as well. Our contractor, Frank Locascio, and his crews have repaired and replaced crumbling masonry, which will ameliorate a number of water and dampness issues throughout the building. The West entry was also found to have rotting woodwork and was also sinking into the ground. The entryway was completely rebuilt and is both safer and more stable.

The next stage is the exterior painting. The bird infestation has been resolved, and crews are beginning to powerwash the exterior and prep for painting. Most of that work will take place on the weekends but not interfere with worship services.

The restoration project will take time, so we ask for your patience. In the meantime, our fund-raising campaign continues. Based on our estimates, we still need significant funding to complete the interior painting, as well as upgrades to the kitchen and Sunday School building.

We ask that you prayerfully consider contributing to this cause. As of the end of August, we have raised just over \$198,000. Remember that a local businessman has agreed to match your gifts up to \$25,000. Earmark donations to the church restoration fund, which will be used exclusively for this effort.
